

## Safety and Our Church

Events and headlines have made the issue of safety in public places a national conversation. Here at Epworth we have a Team of people that have been working on safety and response issues. for over a year. The results of their work have helped us begin to update and adjust many of our policies and actions:

- New and additional AED machines are now throughout the buildina
- Stop the Bleed and updated First Kits have been placed throughout the building
- Updated directional and informational signs inside the building are being added
- Better outdoor signage has been installed plus signage was added to our entry doors
- A Fire Drill on a Sunday morning is being planned for the near future
- Locks have been changed and the alarm system has been updated
- Safe Sanctuary policies are being updated to ensure that all of our children and vulnerable adults remain safe and protected in our building

Epworth's Building Use Policy was updated effective January 1, 2018. An updated version of the policy is available in the Church Office. The updated policy has helped us better serve the many. groups (both inside and outside the church) that utilize our building for meetings and activities.

The existence of our weekday Preschool program makes it important that we maintain restricted access to the building to ensure the safety and security of our children and teachers. Long gone are the days when we can leave the building unlocked or allow direct access to everyone. Therefore, we have updated the process for people gaining entry to the building outside

of Sunday Mornings. The new system balances concerns for security and hospitality and limits the need for keys to the church while restricting those that have access to alarm codes and after-hours access to the building. We believe that this new system allows for easy entry to the building for those needing access while maintaining safety and security protocols.

The process for gaining entry to the building remains simple during the week:



- Monday Thursday 9:00 am 3:00 pm the Church Office and Building are open to the public
- •Monday Thursday 3:∞ pm 8:∞ pm the Church Building is available via key-coded entry

Beginning June 1, 2018 there will no longer be a generic code to enter through the key-coded doors of the church. If you would like a personal code to enter the church front doors simply contact the Church Office and we will be happy to provide you a personal code for entry use. In addition, the Church is available for meetings and events on Friday, Saturday, or Sunday Afternoon by special arrangement with the Church Office per our Church Building Use Policy.

We're very excited to witness the impact our weekly newsletter has had in the overall engagement throughout Epworth's ministries as we have watched dozens of individuals take their next steps in faith, including but not limited to: attending a class, attending a small group, getting involved in a service project, and more!

This further engagement is exactly what we hoped to see in this process, and we're glad that this tool has helped others take their next steps. That being said, we humbly admit that this newsletter isn't finished adapting, and we've been very pleased with the feedback we've received. We look forward to continue reshaping how we communicate as a community of faith.

# Prayer Ministry

Prayer: It's simply a way of living in God's presence. All healthy relationships require communication, so we are intentional about giving those who are important to us our undivided attention, our listening ear and count on them to do the same for us.

Not surprisingly, that's the best way to live in God's presence as well.

So at Epworth, we encourage that communication in several ways:

- corporate prayer during worship
- prayer cards are available in the pew racks (fill out your request and place it in the offering basket during worship or hand it to a staff member)
- the prayer team who prays for specific requests immediately after worship at the prayer rail (anyone is welcome to join in the intercessory prayer or ask for someone to pray with them).

- the prayer chain that communicates prayer requests throughout the week
- the prayer Labyrinth is made available throughout the year for you to walk the path in silence and commune with God
- short term classes are offered throughout the year that help develop prayer practices (Solitude and Silence will be offered on Monday evenings at 6:30 beginning September 10th-watch for sign up)
- the Pastoral Staff and our Stephen Ministers are always available on an individual basis to pray for and with you.

Can you smell it? Can you taste it?


It's that time of year again, as we gear up for our Annual Fish Fry! Here are a few ways you can get involved:
