

Identity Theft is a big problem in our culture and Americans are the largest group of victims.

According to a 2018 survey by The Harris Poll, **60 million** Americans have been affected by **identity theft. 33 percent** of U.S. adults have expe-



rienced **identity theft**, which is more than twice the global average. In 2017, nearly 7% of consumers became victims of **identity fraud** — that's about **1 in 15** people.

Some of the biggest problems that **identity theft** victims are faced with are the lingering effects of having their identity stolen.

If the thief opened new accounts or committed a crime in the victim's name, it can be a long process to correct public records and credit. The average loss is over \$1,300 per person. In total, identity theft victims lose over \$15 billion annually.

This is also an important topic in our lives as God's children. We have an identity theft problem in the church today, but not because our identity has been stolen. At this meeting, you will learn about our congregation and other churches that will gather with us. Plus you will hear from our Conference Superintendent.







Stewardship is not the same as Fundraising

Without the generosity of the congregations in the past, we would not be able to experience the church that we know today. It is up to us to continue the tradition of generosity. We want people to understand not only the story of how we got here, but to also understand the story of where we are going as a church.

The story we will tell belongs to God, but it is our story as well.

Our story is about how together we take part in acts of Loving, Growing, and Serving. Our story is about lovingly inviting people to come to worship, Sunday School, Bible study, Small Groups, Youth group, Family Ministry Events and all the other programs and events that are a part of Epworth. Ours is a story of helping each other grow in faith through Christian education and worship. Our story is a story of service to others through discovering the needs of people and finding ways to meet those needs. Our story is also about supporting ministries and missions that reach beyond our local community and impact the world through our connection to The United Methodist Church. Stewardship is not new, but it has somehow morphed into fundraising and the selling of church programs. We need to once again reclaim the concept of Stewardship in the Church. So remember two important principles regarding the process of stewardship and setting a budget here at Epworth: 1) We do not pledge to a budget - We pledge to give out of our love for God 2) The church is charged with acting as stewards of your gifts - that means the church is not a fundraising group. Church Leadership will develop a budget by establishing priorities for the church and then acting as good stewards with the gifts that are pledged and given. Therefore the budget will be developed after the Stewardship Campaign and shared with the church AFTER the pledges are made. Watch your mailbox later this month for your opportunity to pledge your gifts. We need your pledge to best plan for the coming year.

What's next for us at Epworth?

Sunday October 20th immediately following worship, Epworth convened a special meeting of the church. The purpose of the meeting was to inform the church about the "What's Next? Conference" that Pastor Rodney and Randy Siebert attended at Adam Hamilton's church in Kansas. The conference was focused on providing direction and hope as the United Methodist Church prepares for General Conference in May 2020 and another debate over LGBTQ issues of inclusion.

As General Conference approaches the reality that some type of church division will occur is growing and that has lead to a great deal of anxiety. As was shared, much of the anxiety has occurred because of the lack of communication between differing parties. During the course of our meeting, we discovered that even at Epworth not only are we of differing opinions, but our perception of other's views is not accurate either.

Pastor Rodney shared a plan for the coming year that will bring our congregation together to pray together, study together, and talk with one another. The goal is not that we will all come away with the same views or opinions, but instead by being together and sharing with one another we will grow closer together as a community of faith. And we will gain a better understanding of our own faith. In the end, it will be best if we know who we are individually and as a congregation should the need to vote on any matters. And that knowledge will help eliminate fear of the unknown—in ourselves and in our church.


